2. Review of Interlibrary Loan Methods

Discussion included review of process and volume related to sharing resources: with SWAN, with Internet Access Libraries, with SHARE Illinois Libraries, and with other libraries through use of OCLC ILL.

Efforts are underway to standard library records to make sharing more consistent including accurate information needed to fill out delivery labels.

3. In-Transit Label

The In-Transit delivery label tool is now available to test. The tool will print sticky labels for transit. The In-Transit delivery label will print to/from libraries, as well as a portion of the item title and date/time put in transit. Green Hills Public Library started using the delivery label in production when they joined SWAN.

4. Providing standard ILL statistical reporting (discussion - can we provide a standardized dashboard in BLUEcloud Analytics)

The monthly reports posted to the website are useful helpful. Discussion included the need for a consistent reporting tool to address the ILLINET Traffic Survey requirements. SWAN is working on a composite report to match these reporting requirements with a goal of having this available before the March 31 deadline for reporting FY 18 data.

A review of the SWAN Support Site resources included highlighting of the Interlibrary Loan section including documentation on processing requests from SHARE_IL, Internet Access, and libraries requesting through OCLC, as well as how to process items borrowed from outside the SWAN consortium.

6. Training Tip: Creating a SWAN Group in OCLC WorldShare ILL for Request Deflection

Demonstration included creating a Custom Holdings Group of SWAN symbols and setting up a deflection rule to deflect requests from any SWAN library. Those requests should be made through holds within the SWAN catalog.

7. Patron Initiated Requests

WorldCat Discovery and Find More Illinois provide mechanisms to allow patrons to directly make requests. These requests can be staff-mediated or directly released to lenders. SWAN has configured all SWAN libraries' WorldCat Discovery instances to enable this feature. Patrons are allowed to submit an interlibrary loan request for titles not held in the SWAN consortium. Libraries can further configure their settings as appropriate for their library.

Currently no libraries participate in Find More Illinois but may in the future. This resource sharing platform is supported by RAILS and allows patrons to place requests from participating members. Staff manage the requests through a staff interface.
