Completed 2021 goals

- Migrate RAILS hosted servers to SWAN infrastructure
- Replace SWAN automated voice notification
- Develop AV item type recommendations for SWAN100
- SWAN100: addition of 3 libraries to SWAN
- Recommendation of new catalog: Aspen Discovery
- Implementation of Aspen Discovery
- Scheduled monthly “Your library statistics” report
- Initiative for online self-paced training
- BLUE Acquisitions in production with 3 libraries
- Rental collection with Baker & Taylor rentals to supplement high demand holds
- Implemented Book Club Reservation system pilot – now open to all libraries

BLUEcloud Acquisitions in Production

- From success of BLUEcloud Acquisitions pilot in 2019, 3 new libraries joining SWAN in December 2020 went live in BLUEcloud Acquisitions
- SWAN team and production use libraries worked with SirsiDynix to address duplicate issues in loading records (largely resolved in Fall 2021)

Baker & Taylor Rental

- Baker & Taylor rentals provided a controlled test of introducing needed copies to meet high demand within the consortium
- SWAN now has a contract with Baker & Taylor for rental copies. The first order of rental items were placed in August 2020
- Items selected were based on high demand holds and are immediately holdable for any patrons
- These items were continuously shared, with opportunities for testing roaming collections
- When circulation demand ceased, the items were returned to Baker & Taylor
- Based on thresholds for item retention, some copies were retained permanently and added to shared book club kits managed by member libraries

Goals for 2022

- Expanded BLUEcloud Staff pilot: Circulation Advisory
- Beanstack subscription: offered & shared with common reading initiative
- Group-purchase for rental copies of popular books & movies
- SWAN eXpo resumes in-person August 2022
- Research mobile app usage & options: BLUEcloud Mobile & Aspen app
- Risk assessment and security initiative

What is engagement?


- Patron activity

- Email campaigns
 - New library users
 - Preferred topics

- OCLC WISE

Engagement platform features

- Web-based administration
- Templates for email marketing, targeted at specific patron groups, i.e., segments
- ILS integration means some initial harvest of users & ongoing API connection
- Data integration with other vendors possible (OverDrive)
- Webpage code integrated into library website



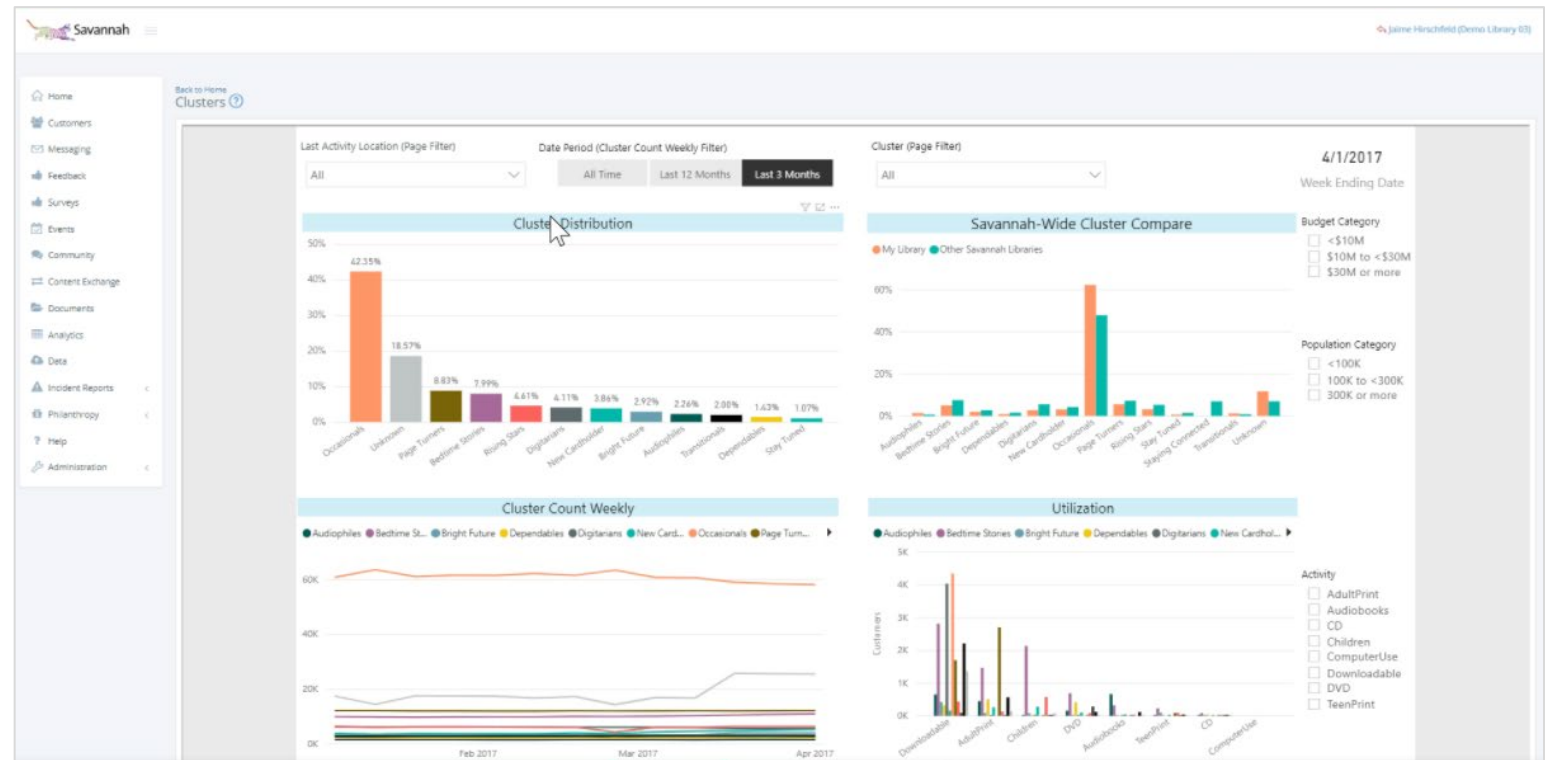

Engagement platforms

Strengths

- Targeted email marketing
- New library card sign-ups
- Email promotion events, follow-up campaigns, library usage & interests

Weaknesses

- Writing back to the ILS
- Not a replacement for routine email notices
 - Platforms not advanced with updating the ILS notification “counters”
 - Borrowed material vs. library patrons vs. reciprocal users

Library & SWAN considerations

- Please involve SWAN early in the selection of your platform
 - Data harvests & API connections take some planning, testing
 - Secure data transfer is required of SWAN member libraries
 - “Walk, don’t run” approach based on library staff interviews

- If there is widespread interest, SWAN could continue research into a specific engagement platform subscription
 - Centralized data harvests & managed segments
 - Support for library marketing staff on data crosswalk

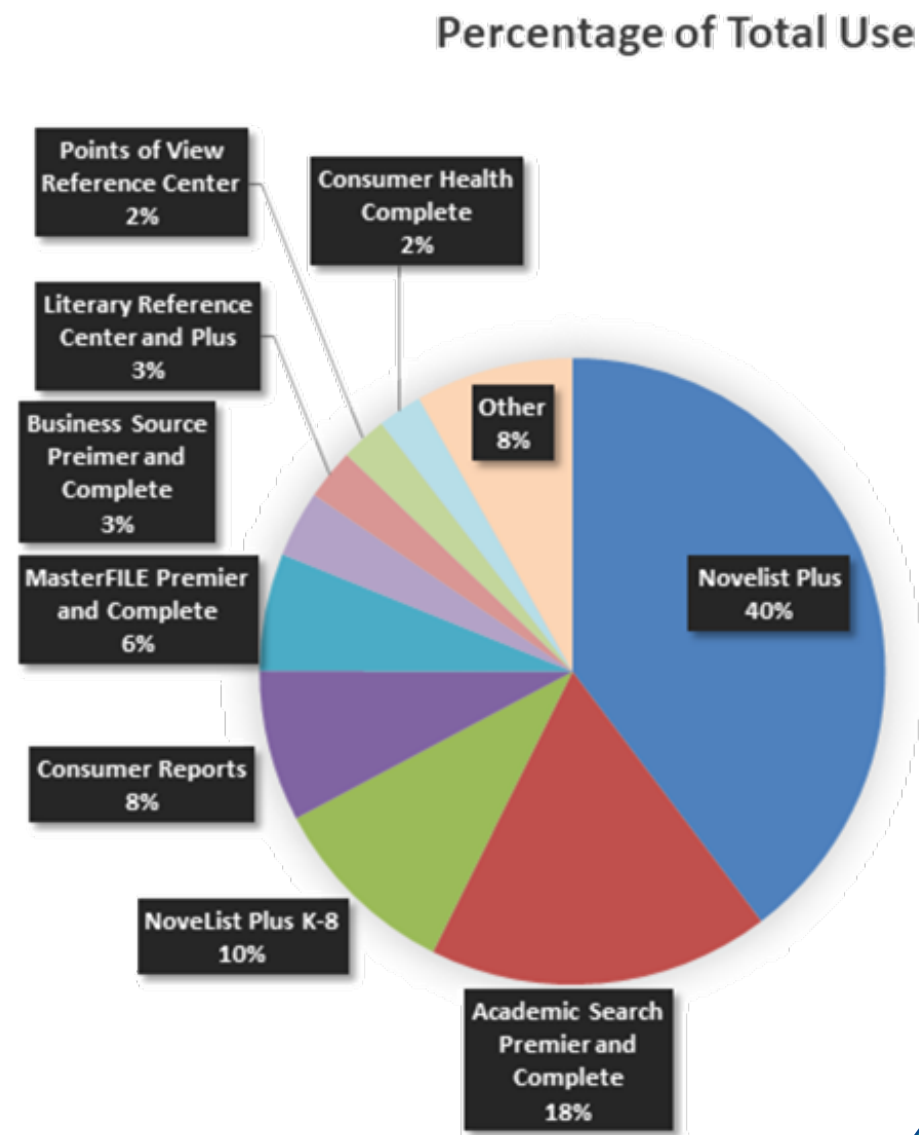

EBSCO database usage

- Niche databases all together get about as much use as Consumer Reports
- Academic Search is the second most-used database – patrons are doing research
- "Big deal" allows SWAN libraries to serve more interests, for the same cost as Novelist & Consumer Reports



EBSCO year-3 renewal

Conversations starting with RAILS & EBSCO

- EBSCO wants opted out libraries requesting to rejoin must do so at full RAILS package B price (based on library service area population)
- SWAN EBSCO group purchase pricing uses 4 library discount tiers (based on library tax revenue)
- Year-3 total price includes 3 new libraries
- Possible 3% increase with the 84-participating year-2 libraries (worst case)

- Opt-out deadline Friday, February 18, 2022

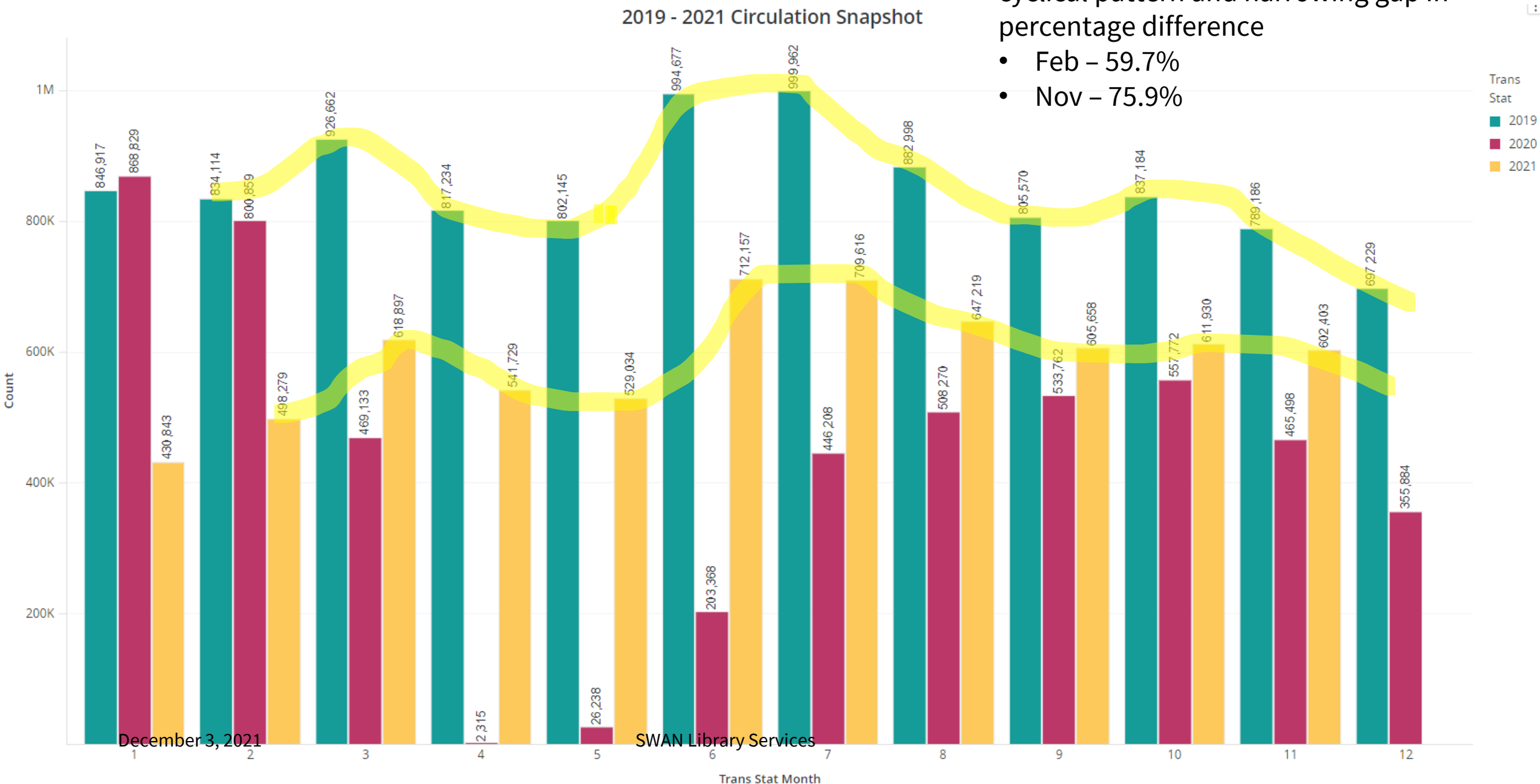

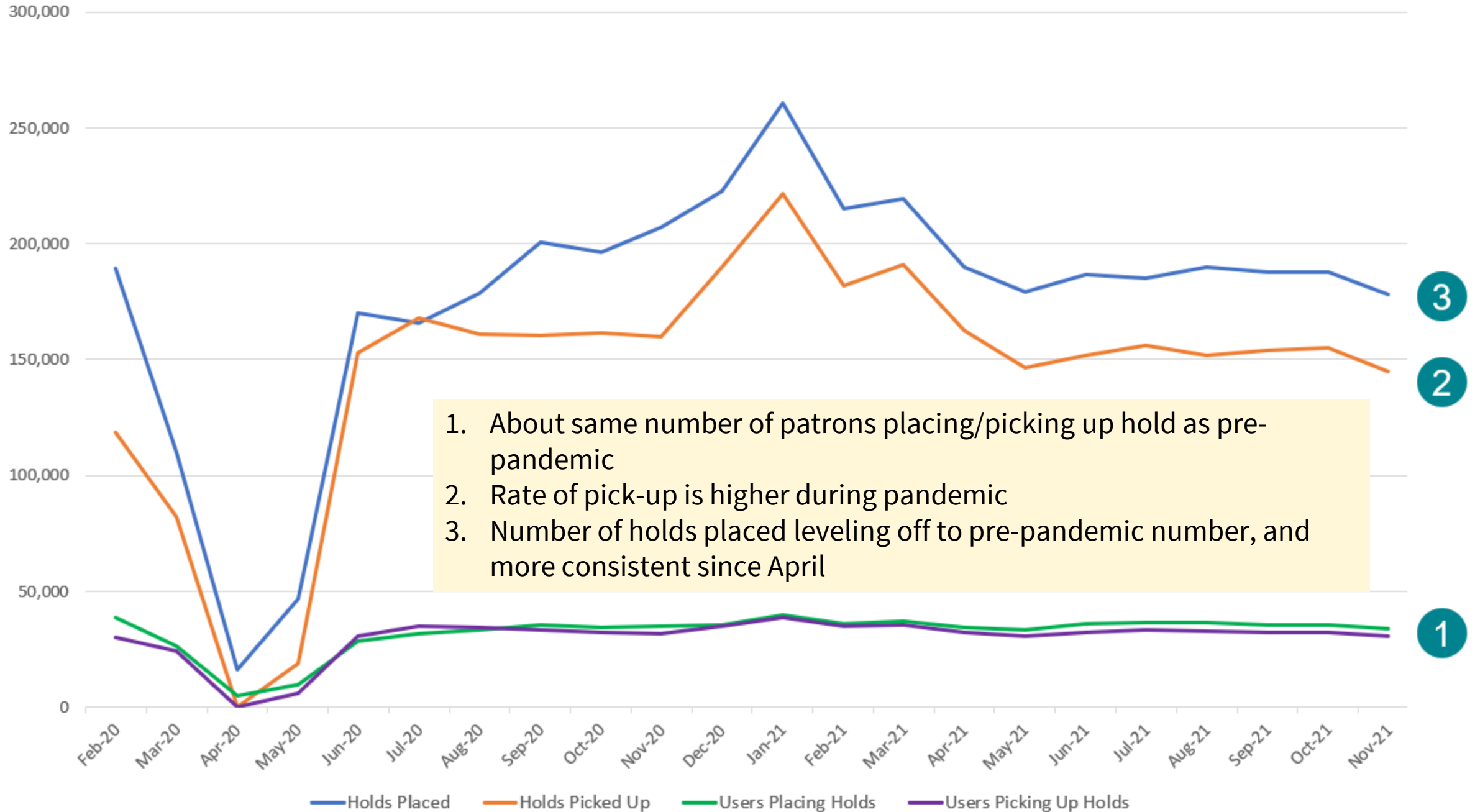

Circulation 2019 vs 2021 show similar cyclical pattern and narrowing gap in percentage difference

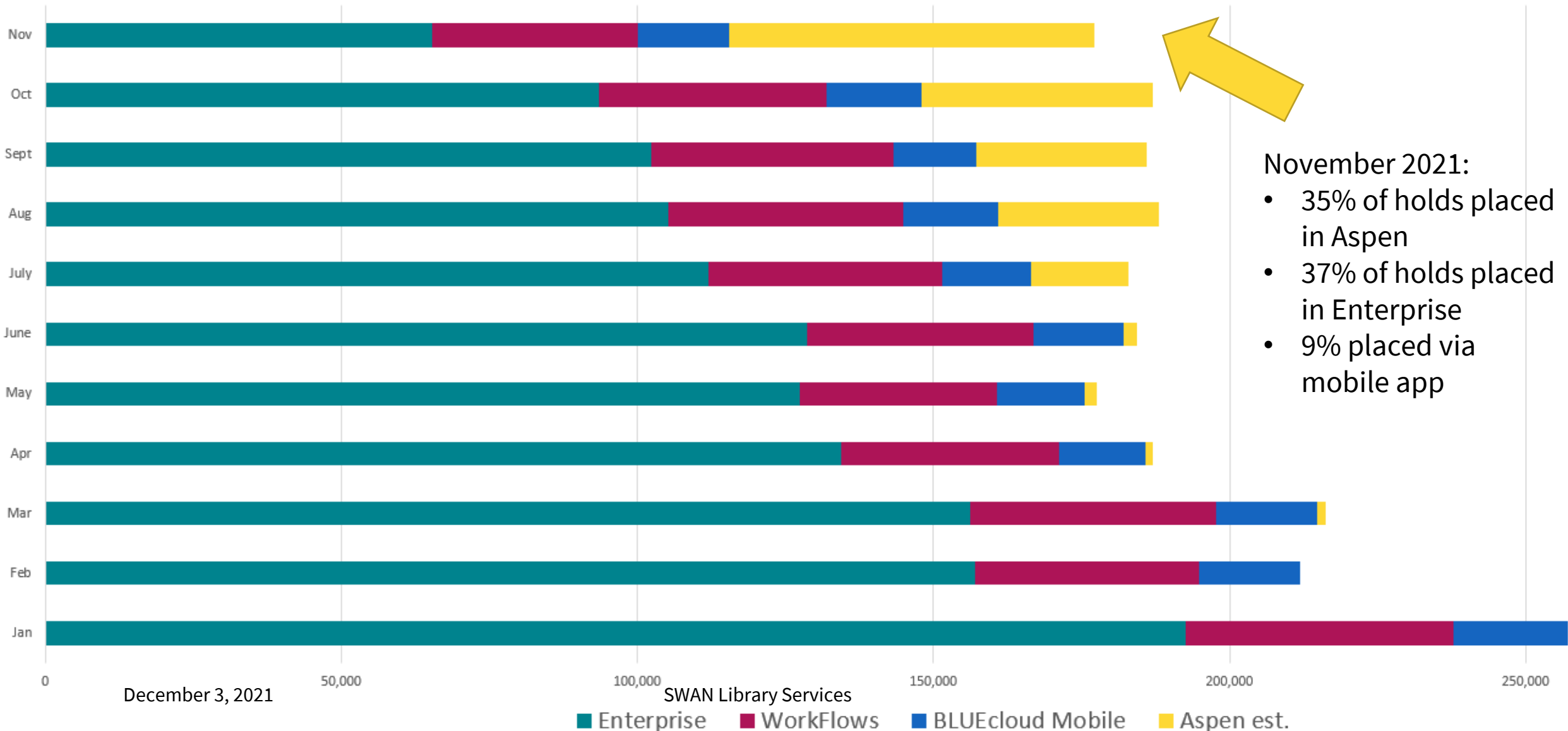
- Feb – 59.7%
